



**Glen E.
'Cooper' Cooper
October 29, 1935 - January 10, 2012**

Glen E. "Cooper" Cooper, 76, died Tuesday Jan. 10, 2012, at his home in Thermopolis, after a long period of illness.

He was born Oct. 29, 1935, of parents Glen Jordan and Edna Stewart. He was later adopted by Raymond Oscar Cooper. Glen graduated from Cheyenne High School and attended the University of Wyoming, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education.

On June 2, 1957, he married Norma Ilene Vosler. They had three children.

Glen and Norma traveled extensively during their life. Glen worked for the Bureau of Indian Affairs and his first assignment was in Dennehotso, Ariz., where Glen was a counselor and teacher at the Indian school.

From there, they moved to Busby, Mont., where he worked with the Cheyenne Indians. He had three jobs – counselor, teacher and principal.

From Montana, they moved to Salem, Ore., where Glen worked at the Indian school, and then to Eagle Butte, S.D., where he was employed as a counselor. From there, Glen and Norma moved to Cave City, Ky., where he worked with the Job Corp. They then moved to Boise, Idaho, where Glen worked for the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Glen's legacy might be his long history of working with and helping others.

Glen and Norma retired to Florida and later moved to Thermopolis, where they have lived for the past number of years.

More than 10 years ago, Glen was diagnosed with cancer and was cured of that so that he could live a productive life. Ten years later, he overcame stomach cancer.

Survivors include his wife of 54 years of Thermopolis; son, Jerry Cooper of Washington, D.C.; daughters, Kim Cooper of Minneapolis, Minn., and Deanna Floyd of Las Vegas, Nev.; and five grandchildren.

Glen was preceded in death by his parents; a brother; and a sister.

Memorial services were held Friday, Jan. 13, 2012, at First Baptist Church in Thermopolis with his brother-in-law Richard Vosler and Pastor Harvey Seidel officiating.
