

Mary Anne Egger-Hogg-Barnhart

August 10, 1929 - October 1, 2011

Mary Anne Barnhart, 82, of Worland died Saturday, Oct. 1, 2011 at the Worland Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center, surrounded by her family.

She was born on Aug. 10, 1929, in Basin at the old Basin Hospital to Thomas and Ann Mary (Bader) Field. She grew up in Ten Sleep and graduated in 1946 from the Ten Sleep High School. She then married Arden Barney Egger in 1947 in Ten Sleep. To this union three children were born and raised on the Pitch Fork Ranch, where Mary Anne was the ranch cook. After Arden Barney's death, she continued to work on the ranch and eventually met Tom Hogg, who was the Husky bulk dealer.

The couple was married in October of 1960 and made their home in Meeteetse. This union brought two stepchildren into Mary Anne's life and two more children were born to them. In 1966, the family moved to Worland. Mary Anne was a homemaker, raising her children and attending school events whenever she could. When the opportunity for school cook became available, she gladly accepted. This eventually led to the position of Food Service Coordinator for Washakie County School District No. 1. She held this position until retiring in the early 1990s. Her husband, Tom, passed away in September of 1987.

She later married Barney Barnhart, a close family friend, in Worland in December, 1992. They made their home in Worland and Thermopolis until her death. Mary Anne loved traveling and fishing with Barney. She was an incredible cook who always had something to share with family and friends. She was a member of St. Alban's Episcopal Church for over 40 years.

She is survived by her husband, Barney, of Worland; her children, Butch (Marsha) Egger of Lander, Barney (Terry) Egger of Deaver, Mina (Roy) Holm of Cody, Dee Dee (Ken) Wagner of Casper, Holly (Willy) Worley of Worland and Lisa (Greg) McClure of Sheridan; 17 grandchildren; 17 step-grandchildren; and 16 great-grandchildren.

Mary Anne was preceded in death by her parents; husbands Arden Barney Egger and Thomas Hogg; and stepson, "little" Tom Hogg.
