



Geraldine L. Moore Jackson

July 12, 1921 - November 16, 2011

Geraldine L. Moore Jackson, 90, died Wednesday, Nov. 16, 2011, at Washakie Medical Center in Worland. She entered Worland Healthcare in October.

Born July 12, 1921, in Medicine Bow, Geraldine was the daughter of David and Rose (Nelson) Wray. She attended Medicine Bow School until age 10, then Hyattville through the eighth grade. In 1939, she graduated from Casper High School.

On July 5, 1940, she married Clarence Udie Moore. They lived all along the CB&Q railroad, during which time Geraldine was a full-time wife and mother. In 1952, the family moved to Bonneville, remaining there until 1964 when they moved to Thermopolis. Later, the couple moved to Deaver and returned to Thermopolis in 1979. Clarence died in 1983.

For a few years, Geraldine was a housekeeper at the Wyoming Pioneer Home, then continued as a volunteer for 14 years. She was a member of the VFW Auxiliary and the First Baptist Church. She enjoyed traveling and going to the mountains.

On Nov. 25, 1995, Geraldine married Alfred Jackson and they continued to live in Thermopolis.

Survivors include her husband, Alfred, of Cody; sons, David Moore of Warsaw, Ind., and Clarence, Jr. of Basin; daughter, Carol Faith of Thermopolis; sister, Evelyn Pinkerton; six grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; and two great, great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her first husband; parents; and two sisters, Cora Burroughs and Georgie Monk.

Funeral services were held Monday, Nov. 21 at Mortimore Funeral Home with the Rev. John Harrington of the Risen Son Southern Baptist Church officiating. Cremation took place with inurnment at Monument Hill Cemetery.
