PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Procedural Rules and Special Regulations, notice is hereby given of the application of Rocky Mountain Power (RMP or the Company) for authority to sell certain co-generation assets and transmission facilities located in Camas, Washington, as more fully described below.

RMP is a public utility, as defined in W.S. §37-1-101(a)(vi)(C), providing retail electric public utility service under certificates of public convenience and necessity issued by the Commission. RMP is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction pursuant to W.S. §37-2-112. RMP also provides electric retail service under the name Pacific Power in Oregon, Washington and California. GP Camas is a limited liability company in Washington. It maintains and operates a manufacturing facility in Camas, Washington.

On April 3, 2015, RMP filed an application requesting authority to sell certain co-generation assets and transmission facilities located in Camas, Washington and a 69 kilovolt (kV) transmission line to Georgia-Pacific Consumer Products (Camas) LLC (GP Camas). In the application, RMP states that in January 1993, PacifiCorp and James River Paper Company entered into certain development, construction, operation and steam supply agreements (collectively the Camas Agreements). (Application Attachment A). The Camas Agreements allowed PacifiCorp to lease

land at the mill site in Camas, Washington and construct and own a 50 megawatt high-efficiency steam turbine generator, electrical substation and step-up transformer and associated controls and equipment (collectively the Co-Generation Assets). Under the Camas Agreements, PacifiCorp purchased from James River the 69 kV transmission lines, towers and associated components that start at the Co-Generation Assets at the mill and extend across Lady Island as a double-circuit to PacifiCorp's Troutdale substation in Troutdale, Oregon (collectively Transmission Facilities).

Under the Camas Agreements, James River received 100 percent of the steam by-product for drying paper at the mill, PacifiCorp received 100 percent of the electricity generated and supplied James River with 100 percent of the mill electricity needs under retail Oregon Schedule 481. James River operated the Co-Generation Assets and provided 100 percent of the fuel for the term of the Camas Agreements. In 2000, GP Camas became the successor-in-interest to James River.

The Camas Agreements are scheduled to expire December 31, 2015, and PacifiCorp and GP Camas (the Parties) have agreed not to renew them. The Parties have negotiated an agreement for GP Camas to elect to purchase the Co-Generation Assets at fair market value no later than six months after the termination of the Camas Agreements. (Application Attachment B). The Parties also negotiated an agreement granting GP Camas the option to purchase the Transmission Facilities from PacifiCorp at a price equal to the book value (Application Attachment C). Pending regulatory approval, the Parties valued the Co-Generation Asses at \$350,000 and the Transmission Facilities at \$135,967.76 for a total asset sales price of \$485,967.76 which was determined to be the least cost, risk-adjusted option.

RMP asserts the transaction serves the public interest because it represents the best balance of cost and risk for customers. RMP represents that disposition of the Co-Generation Assets and Transmission Facilities by the Company will not adversely affect retail or wholesale customers because they are used primarily to serve the GP Camas Mill site in Camas, Washington. Further the discontinuation of the steam turbine generator's nameplate capacity of 50 MW, which currently operated between 10 and 14 MW, will have no material effect on the Company's generation capacity, which is comprised of approximately 10,579 MW.

This is not a complete description of the application. Interested persons may inspect the application at RMP's business office throughout Wyoming and at the Commission's offices in Cheyenne, Wyoming, during regular business hours.

Anyone wishing to file a statement, intervention petition, protest or request for a public hearing in this matter must do so in writing filed with the Commission on or before May 8, 2015. Any intervention request filed with the Commission shall set forth the grounds of the proposed intervention or request for hearing as well as the position and the interest of the petitioner in this proceeding. Please be sure to mention Docket No. 20000-475-EA-15 in all correspondence with the Commission

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The Thermopolis Town Council met in regular session April 7, 2015 at 7 p.m. at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Mike Mortimore, Council members Tony Larson, John Dorman Sr., Mark Nelson and Dusty Lewis. Also, present were Clerk/Treasurer Tracey Van Heule, Public Works Director Ernie Slagle, Police Chief Steven Shay, Town Engineer Heath Overfield and Town Attorney Mike Messenger. Assistant to the Mayor/Codes Administrative Assistant Fred Crosby was absent.

AGENDA: Following the pledge of allegiance, Nelson made a motion, seconded by Larson and carried to approve the agenda as written.

MINUTES: Larson made a motion, seconded by Lewis and carried to approve the Council meeting minutes from March 3 and 17, 2015 and the work session minutes from March 23, 2015.

BILLS: Lewis made a motion, seconded by Nelson and carried to approve the General, Enterprise and Special Fund bills for March 2015. Larson and Mortimore abstained on the approval of the bills to their businesses.

PUBLIC HEARING: ONE EYED BUFFALO BREWING COMPANY RESTAURANT AND MICROBREWERY LIQUOR LICENSES: At 7:02 p.m. a public hearing was opened for comment on a new restaurant and microbrewery liquor license application. EDC Director, Amanda Moeller noted the business will be a great asset to downtown. No other comments were made. Mortimore closed the public hearing at 7:04 p.m. Larson made a motion, seconded by Mortimore and carried to approve the liquor licenses for One Eyed Buffalo Brewing Company LLC for the period of May 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: KEN AVERILL: TREE CITY/ARBOR DAY GRANT: Mr. Averill was not present. Ron Raile, representing Central Wyoming Tree Service, noted he would establish and run a Tree Board. Other requirements include celebrating Arbor Day and a Town ordinance on trees. Nelson made a motion and Lewis seconded by Lewis for the Town of Thermopolis to become a member

of Tree City USA. Additional discussion ensued on other communities which require a community pride activity in exchange for a free tree. Motion carried.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: TAWNA MCQUEEN: RODEO PARADE: Lewis made a motion and Larson seconded to approve the street closure request for the rodeo parade on June 27th at 10 am. Discussion ensued on obtaining WYDOT approval, the route and coordination with police and public works. Motion carried.

TOWN ENGINEER: PAY ESTIMATES: Overfield noted pay estimate number three to Wilson Bros. for \$109,161.47 for the 1st Street Sewer was in the list of bills.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Police Chief Steve Shay presented the March reports and introduced new officer Mark Raymond. Public Works Director Slagle presented March reports for Streets and Alleys, Water, Wastewater, Sanitation and Landfill departments.

TOWN ATTORNEY: LANDFILL AND JOINT LAW ENFORCEMENT (JLE) AGREEMENT EXTENSIONS: Messenger noted drafts were presented to the County Attorney and no comment was received. Nelson made a motion, seconded by Larson and carried to approve the Joint Law Enforcement extension. Larson made a motion, seconded by Nelson and carried to approve the Landfill extension agreement.

TOWN ATTORNEY: FIRST READING OF AN ORDINANCE TO ALLOW THE SALE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN TOWN LIMITS: Messenger read the ordinance. Nelson made a motion and Larson seconded to approve the ordinance on first reading. Discussion ensued on adding the Town as an additional insured, establishing time limits for sales, state rules and fire restrictions. Nelson made a motion to amend his motion and Larson seconded to add the Town of Thermopolis as an additional insured, to allow the sale of fireworks for 14 days around the 4th of July and 7 days around New Years. Motion carried to approve the amendment. Motion carried to approve the first reading of the proposed ordinance.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: TOWN AUDIT CONTRACT: Nelson made a motion, Larson seconded and carried to approve the Town's audit contract with Korerwitz, Michel, Wright and Associates.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: WEED AND PEST LETTER: Nelson made a motion, Lewis seconded and carried to allow the Mayor to sign a letter allowing aerial mosquito spraying as necessary.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL: OTHER: The meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m. The next Council meeting is April 21, 2015 at 7 p.m.
