The Hot Springs County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, October 4, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Room at the Courthouse.

Present were Commissioners Brad Basse and Tom Ryan. Also present were County Clerk Nina Webber, County Attorney Jerry D. Williams and Administrative Assistant to the Commissioners Penny Herdt. Commissioner John Lumley was absent due to medical reasons. Vice-Chairman Ryan led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Vice-Chairman Ryan noted that Roberts Rules of Order would be suspended so that business might be conducted in the absence of Commissioner Lumley.

Approval of Agenda

Brad Basse made a motion to approve the agenda with the following changes:

NDC Member Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes

Brad Basse made a motion to approve the minutes of September 6. 2016 and September 20, 2016 as submitted. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

FBO Monthly Operations Report

Owl Creek Aviation representative Nate Messenger reported there were 112 total operations last month. At least one aircraft diverted to another airport due to the lack of a published approach. Fuel sales were 723.4 gallons of AvGas and 548.6 gallons of Jet fuel. Both fuel systems are now fully operational as is the card reader system. Mr. Messenger expressed some concern regarding apparent settling between the fueling apron concrete and the asphalt. GDA has been contacted regarding this and has asked Nate to keep an eye on the area and report any further activity. Mr. Messenger reported that Road & Bridge has finished the gravel application to control drainage next to the SRE building.

Maintenance Monthly Report

Maintenance Foreman Chuck Carver informed the Commissioners that he has been working on the leak at the Senior Center, but it is not resolved yet. There was an Auto Vent failure which caused a minor leak at the Library resulting in ceiling tile damage. The new vent is on order and the tile will be replaced. The door closer has been ordered but has not yet been received. The leak near the back door of the Museum has been eliminated with new gutters and drains. The sumps seem to be working well at this time. The lower window trim at the Ag Extension building has been repaired as needed, primed and painted. Mr. Carver indicated the upper trim will be addressed next spring. There was a small roof leak in the building that has been repaired and Mr. Carver expects the roof to last a few more years yet. The lawn sprinkling system will be winterized in the next couple of weeks.

Road and Bridge Monthly Report

Road and Bridge Supervisor Dave Schlager reported that the fall blading is nearly done. Mowing is almost finished for the year. Cattle guards were cleaned and rock replaced in some of the pipes on Lower Cottonwood Road. Potholes have been patched. Rebuilding of Gooseberry road continues. Mr. Schlager asked for and received approval from the Commissioners to replace his computer. The money will come from his equipment/machinery budget. Mr. Schlager reported that he will be out on sick leave for several weeks due to shoulder surgery scheduled for the last week of October.

Delbert Daniels will be in charge while he is gone. The blade buyback/replacement proposal has not been received from Honnen Equipment yet. The drainage project for the Fairbuilding seems to be working very well. Mr. Schlager indicated it would be at least a year before results will be apparent inside the building.

Planner Monthly Report

Planner Bo Bowman reported that the NRPC will meet next week. This board would like the Commissioners to submit a written request to the BLM for more involvement as cooperators in the ongoing sage grouse studies. Mr. Bowman does not have any more information regarding Mike Baker's participation in the Sage Grouse working group at this time. The Land Use Planning Board completed their work on the draft of the Revised Land Use Plan last month. Mr. Bowman will submit it to the Commissioners and the County Attorney for review this month. There will be no LUPB meeting in October due to election judge training. Septic system applications continue to trickle in. Mr. Bowman noted that most of the applications received this year were for new construction as opposed to replacement systems. The DEQ conducted a Storm Water Quality permit inspection at the County shop last week. The inspection went very well, but a final report has not been received at this time.

Youth Alternatives Monthly Report

Youth Alternatives Director Barb Rice reported that she has seven participants in her program at this time. The VOA/OJJDP grant funding has been received as a supplement to the 2014-2015 Non-Participating State award instead of a new 2016-2017 Non-Participating State award. The funding amount remains the same as last year. Ms. Rice presented her quarterly draw down request for the Commissioners' review and approval. Brad Basse moved to approve the quarterly drawdown request for the VOA/OJJDP 2014-2015 Nonparticipating State Award Subgrant for the time period of July 1 – September 30, 2016 in the amount of \$4,665.38. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Emergency Management Monthly Report

Emergency Management Coordinator Bill Gordon reported that, with the recent rains, many of the waterways in the county are running at above normal levels, but he does not anticipate any problems with flooding at this time. Mr. Gordon will be attending the semi-annual Emergency Managers conference in Casper later this month.

Tax Rebates / Supplementals

County Assessor Shelley Deromedi presented the following rebate for the Commissioners' ap-

Rebate #2-16 to KASTNER, Jim and THORN-LEY, Denise, % LEWIS, Vernena, Parcel #2748 for tax year 2016. The mobile home on this parcel should have been split off the land and assessed to other owners, resulting in overassessment to LEWIS in the amount of 5070. This requires a rebate in the amount of \$353.00.

Brad Basse moved to approve Rebate #2-16 to Jim Kastner and Denise Thornley, c/o Vernena Lewis for parcel #2748 in the amount of \$353.00. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The following Supplemental has been processed

through the Treasurer's Office: KASTNER, Jim and THORNLEY, Denise -New Parcel #6842 for tax year 2016. The mobile home was assessed with land originally, but should have been listed separately, requiring the creation of a new parcel, with taxes in the

amount of \$353.00. MARATHON OIL COMPANY - DOR NOVC 2016-0612 - Parcel #995 for tax year 2015 (District #100) – Oil Production at Gooseberry Unit, Group #008025 during 2014. Marathon filed amended return on their own initiative to change the value on this Gooseberry Unit, resulting in underassessment of 2,179, taxes in the amount of \$139.45.

Life Flight Helicopter Landing Area Re-<u>quest</u>

The Commissioners discussed a request from for approval of using the area behind the Fire Hall for landing the Life Flight helicopter if the emergency situation warrants it. As the land belongs to the Fire District, the Commissioners felt they did not bear the responsibility of approving this request, but stated their support for the plan.

Airport Update

<u>Job Trailer Bid Documents</u> – GDA representative Jeremy Gilb reviewed the draft bid documents for the job trailer. At the Commissioners' request, a statement informing potential bidders of the existence of a minimum bid will be added to the documents before they are published.

<u>T Hangar Update</u> – Mr. Gilb noted that the Fire Marshall's office has agreed to use the 2011 Electrical Code in their plan reviews for the Thangars. Revised copies of the plans have been submitted to the Fire Marshall's office. Mr. Gilb will continue to check on this until a response is forthcoming.

Miscellaneous - Mr. Gilb reminded the Commissioners that the next cutoff date for notification of closure of the old airport is November 23, 2016 with publication of the notice January 5, 2017. Mr. Gilb asked the Commissioners to talk to Dave Schlager regarding the gravel placed on the north side of the SRE building. The design was to have the gravel extend all the way to the sidewalk, but it stops considerably short of that. Commissioner Ryan will discuss this with Mr. Schlager.

Old Airport Reuse Study Proposal - GDA representative Dustin Spomer reviewed GDA's proposal to conduct a reuse study for the old airport. No action was taken on the proposal at this time, as the Commissioners agreed they wanted to have all three Commissioners present before making a decision as to which level of proposal to accept.

Other Business

Kirby Treated Water County-Wide Consensus Request – The Town of Kirby submitted a request for consideration to use FY 15-16 County-Wide Consensus funds for their Storage Tank Supply Line Project. After reviewing the request, the Commissioners agreed that any decision would require input from the Town of Thermopolis and a more detailed proposal from the Town of Kirby. Commissioner Basse will work with Fred Crosby to arrange a meeting with regard to this proposal. Fairgrounds Multi-Purpose Building Upgrade <u>Draw Down Request #1</u> – Clerk Webber presented Draw Down Request #1 for the Fairgrounds Multi-Purpose Building Upgrade for the Commissioners' approval. Brad Basse moved to approve SLIB Draw Down Request #1 for the M-P Building Upgrade in the amount of \$17,200.00. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Discussion: Commissioner Ryan noted that the heat tapes have been ordered for this project and should be installed later this month. Motion carried.

Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Procedural Rules and Special Regulations, notice is hereby given of the Application of Rocky Mountain Power (RMP or the Company), for authority to adjust the Category 2 and 3 Demand-Side Management Surcharge Rates in Electric Service Schedule No. 191 – Customer Efficiency Service Charge.

RMP is a public utility as defined in Wyo. Stat. § 37-1-101(a)(vi)(C), subject to the Commission's jurisdiction pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 37-2-112.

On September 30, 2016, RMP filed its Application requesting authority to adjust the non-residential small general service (Category 2) and non-residential large general service (Category 3) Demand-Side Management Surcharge Rates in Electric Service Schedule No. 191 - Customer Efficiency Service Charge. The Company is proposing in the alternative to either: [i] adjust the Schedule 191 Category 2 and 3 rates to 2.37% and 0.76%, respectively, if effective January 1, 2017, or, [ii] adjust the Schedule 191 Category 2 and 3 rates to the percentage amounts provided in Table 2 to the Application, depending on the approved effective date. RMP states that as of August 2016, the balancing account for Categories 2 and 3 are under-collected with balances of approximately of \$1.26 million and \$724,000, respectively, owing to the Company. Taking into account the current under-collected balances and the forecast DSM expenditures through December 2017, RMP states that the longer the current rates remain in effect, the greater the under-collected balances will be for Categories 2 and 3. To address the under-collected balances, RMP states an increase in rates is necessary to bring the balances down to an acceptable level. In order to lessen the impact on customers and keep rate increases to a minimum, RMP is proposing to recover the under-collected balances over a sixteen month period, using the forecast balance six months out from the effective date of the increase rates.

This is not a complete description of the Application. Interested persons may inspect the Application at RMP's business offices throughout Wyoming and at the Commission's offices in Cheyenne, Wyoming, during regular business hours.
