<u>Public Hearing – Approve FY 2018-2019</u> <u>Budget</u>

The Chairman opened the public hearing for the finalization of the FY 2018-2019 Hot Springs County Budget at 12:05 p.m. The Commissioners reviewed the Summary of Budget 2018-2019, together with the proposed changes thereto. The final assessed valuation for the 2018-2019 budget year is \$143,779,630. The County will levy 12 mills this year, which will be equal to \$1,725,355.56. Total anticipated revenue for the year is \$4,269,086.52, and the cash carried forward totaled \$6,072,797.00. EDC representatives requested the Commissioners consider adding \$7000.00 in funding for the Economic Development Corporation. After three calls for further public comment, receiving none, the public hearing was declared closed at 12:10 p.m. The Commissioners shifted \$7,000.00 from Emergency Expenditures to Economic Development. The final budget for FY2018-2019 was approved as submitted. The

Present were Commissioners Tom Ryan, Phillip Scheel, and John Lumley. Also present was County Clerk Nina Webber, County Attorney Jerry Williams, and Administrative Assistant to the Commissioners Penny Herdt. Chairman Ryan led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda – The agenda was approved with the following changes: DELETE: Jeff Schroeder 2. Law Enforcement Issues.

Planner Monthly Report – The WPLI public comment period closed July 16th at 5:00 p.m. There will be at least one more meeting of the WPLI group to finalize the recommendations at the beginning of August. The NRPC will not meet in July. The Land Use Planning Board will

meet on July 18th for a work session on Chapter

6 of the land use plan revision. Tri-Hydro out of Laramie has been selected as the consultant for the Brownfields project at the old airport site. A site tour is scheduled for July 30th at 10:00 a.m. and work is anticipated to be completed later this year. The BLM and Wyo-Ben are still working on the archeological agreement for the Coal Draw mining site. Due to the large number of artifacts in the area, this is anticipated to be an extended negotiation. Wyo-Ben hopes to have the mine site opened by 2020. The DEQ Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan permits for the gravel pits and the Road & Bridge shop have been approved through 2023.

Special Counsel Request – Coroner – The Coroner appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the hiring of a special counsel to sue for the release of bones being held by the Sheriff's department as evidence in a twenty-six year-old murder investigation. The bones have recently been identified and the family would like to have them returned for burial. The Commissioners declined to authorize the hiring of a special counsel.

AHSG06A Agency Agreement – The Commissioners authorized the chairman's electronic signature on the AHSG06A Agency Agreement between Hot Springs County and WYDOT-Aeronautics for Federal Aid Project #03-56-0043-010-2018 (Terminal Drainage) dated July 9, 2018.

Office Equipment – County Attorney – The Commissioners authorized the purchase of a chair and standup desktop for the Deputy County Attorney for an amount not to exceed \$500.00, funds to come from Courthouse Equipment.

<u>Correspondence</u> – Fair Board Minutes – June, 2018; Wyoming Association of Municipalities – WAM-WCCA Energy Lease Program Request For Proposals; NOWCAP – Housing Preservation Program Notification; LGLP – Annual Public Records Notification. The Commissioners reviewed the foregoing correspondence. No further action was required.

AGENDA: Following the pledge of allegiance, Malloy made a motion, seconded by Larson and carried to approve the agenda as written.

ASSET DELETIONS: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Larson and carried to approve the \$16,628.00 Enterprise asset deletion list.

RESOLUTION 545: BUDGET ADJUSTMENT: Mortimore made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve and adopt Resolution 545, which adjusts the budget to reflect actual costs.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Lewis and carried to approve the financial statement for June 2018.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: SHORTY'S — CATERING PERMITS: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Larson and carried to approve three catering permits. The permits for Shorty's Liquor include the Ranch Rodeo on August 4th and 5th and Chamber Derby on August 18th. Both events

are at the fairgrounds and have Fair Board approval

<u>CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: MAIN STREET</u> <u>GRANT UPDATES:</u> No one was present.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: JOHN GER-RELLS – VFW FLAG REQUEST: Gerrells requested putting flags on 18 decorative light poles on Broadway between 4th and 6th street on major holidays. Larson made a motion, seconded by Lewis and carried to allow the VFW to display 3x5 flags on the decorative light poles on Broadway.

ENGINEER: ANTHONY BARNETT: PROJECT UPDATES: Barnett noted the Fremont drain project is progressing and the upper drain may not be needed. The water line project is also progressing. Overfield noted he is working on the 5-year DEQ permit for the sewer plant and the 5-year storm water permits for the town shop and landfill shop.

TOWN ATTORNEY: BOBBI OVERFIELD: SECOND READING OF AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE ALLOCATION OF REPAIR COSTS ON WATER SERVICE LINES: Following the reading of the ordinance, extensive discussion ensued. Larson made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to table and rewrite the proposed ordinance.

TOWN ATTORNEY: BOBBI OVERFIELD: SECOND READING OF AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE RESIDENTIAL FENCING REGULATIONS: Following the reading, Lewis made a motion and Dorman seconded to approve the second reading of the ordinance. Crosby noted the ordinance allows the codes administrator to approve corner-lot fence applications, rather than the Variance board (which only meets once a month). To date, the Variance board has approved all corner-lot fence applications. Heath Overfield noted a right-of-way permit is necessary if they go beyond the property line and would require Mayor and Council approval. Motion carried.

<u>ADMINISTRATION:</u> Heath Overfield noted Gottsche had purchased the required permits and begun work on their project.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: OTHER: At 7:58pm the Mayor and Council entered into executive session for litigation as allowed under Wyoming statute 16-4-405(a)(iii). At 8:17pm the council meeting resumed and then immediately adjourned. The next Council meeting is August 7, at 7pm.

The Hot Springs County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Wednesday, July 3, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Meeting Room at the Government Annex. Present were Commissioners Tom Ryan, John Lumley and Phillip Scheel. Also present were County Clerk Nina Webber and Administrative Assistant to the Commissioners Penny Herdt. Chairman Lumley led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda - The agenda was approved with the following changes: ADD: Becky Mortimore/Other Business 3. Prevention Proposal; Commissioners - 4. Administrative Services Agreement - Health Insurance; DELETE: Bo Bowman 6. Planner Monthly Report

Approval of Minutes - The minutes of the June 5th and June 19th meeting were approved as presented. FBO Monthly Report-There were 174 total operations during June. There were 2,109 gallons of AvGas and 792 gallons of Jet Fuel sold last month. The Airport 5010 Inspection - Master Record Update was presented and the areas of concern cited in the report were addressed. The Commissioners expressed satisfaction with the FBO's response to the inspection report.

Road & Bridge Monthly Report - Gravel ling on Grass Creek road is complete. Rebuilding of a section of Buffalo Creek road has begun. There will be approximately 2000 yards of road millings available from WYDOT for use in County road repairs this year. Jake Owens has been hired as the newest hand in the Road & Bridge department. Nick Dowdy will be retiring August 8th. Missouri Flats Road Issues – A local landowner presented two perceived safety issues on Missouri Flats Road – a bump at mile marker 750 which is the result of a repair and severe deterioration of the road surface from mile marker 1200 on. A warning sign will be placed near the bump until it subsides. The Road & Bridge supervisor reported that there is a plan in progress to take a section of Missouri Flats road back to a wellmaintained gravel road beginning approximately 6.75 miles from the highway intersection and continuing on about four miles. Bryce Approach Agreement - The Commissioners approved an approach agreement submitted by Jon Bryce for an approach located approximately 0.2 miles from the start of County Road 12. WRRSP / Crash Data Report - The WRRSP Crash Data Report for a ten year period from 1/1/08-3/2/18 was presented. The Road & Bridge department will be posting warning signs in the most affected areas.

<u>Maintenance Monthly Report</u> – HVAC repairs in Law Enforcement and the Library are underway. The rooftop HVAC units for the Senior Center have been ordered and should arrive in a couple of weeks. All repairs are complete from the Museum fire. The Shaffer family was granted permission to install a granite bench and plaque under their tree in the memorial grove behind the library.

Youth Alternatives Monthly Report - The YA Director reported twelve participants in the program at this time. The department has acquired a new lawn mower and a new weed eater to assist with some of the Community Service projects. The Commissioners approved the Amendment to the 2018-2019 Sub-Award agreement between Hot Springs County and Volunteers of America Northern Rockies. The Commissioners approved the quarterly VOA-OJJDP 2018-2019 Nonparticipating State Award Subgrant CFDA #16.540 Reimbursement Request in the amount of \$1,870.77.

Emergency Management Monthly Report - Boysen is still about one foot into the flood pool Dam releases have been reduced to 5,000 cfs. The Commissioners authorized the installation of an antennae on the AEOC building for the Ham Radio equipment located at the Alternate Emergency Operations Center.

Leadership Wyoming Sponsorship - Commissioner Phillip Scheel has been selected to participate in the Leadership Wyoming program. The sponsorship fee is being covered by the Wyoming County Commissioners Association. The Commissioners authorized Commissioner Scheel to submit vouchers for mileage, meals and motels when he travels to participate in this program over the next year.

<u>PILT Payments</u> – Kane County, Utah has filed a class action suit regarding underpayment of PILT by the federal government in 2013-2015. The Commissioners approved the County's participation in the class action suit. Hot Springs County's share of the unpaid funds being sought by the lawsuit is approximately \$33,000.00. Jerry Williams will be designated as the County's point of contact. The 2018 PILT payment received was \$849,912.00.

Award Commissioners Renewal Scholarship - The Commissioners awarded the Commissioners' Scholarship renewal to Jessie Pennoyer for the 2018-2019 academic year.

Other Business - Designate NACO Live **Healthy Point of Contact** – The Commissioners designated Marie McDougall as the County's point of contact for the NACO Live Healthy Prescription, Health, and Dental Discount Program.
