Longtime resident Alice R. Toth, 90, died Thursday, May 19, 2011, at Hot Springs County Memorial Hospital in Thermopolis.

Born Sept. 17, 1920, in Omaha, Neb., she was the daughter of James and Frances (Stanek) Brejcha. The family moved to Alcova and Casper, then to Thermopolis in 1926 where Alice began first grade. Alice lived in Thermopolis since that time.

Following graduation as salutatorian in 1938, she attended the University of Wyoming for one year.

She worked for the Hot Springs County superintendent of rural schools for two years. For the next 32 years, she was employed by the Department of Public Assistance and Social Services, retiring in 1982.

On Dec. 9, 1941, Alice married Louis S. Toth in Billings, Mont. She loved bowling and was the first woman to be inducted into the local Bowlers Hall of Fame in 1994. She also enjoyed bridge, reading, working in her yard and home, and time with her family.

Since 1985, Alice served on the Senior Citizen Project Council and was secretary of the Golden Age Club. In 1934, she became a member of Community Federated Church and was a past board member. Other memberships were Vesper Chapter #19, Order of Eastern Star serving as Worthy Matron for a year; past president of Thermopolis Woman's Club; BPO Does and was treasurer for many years; Eagles #1884 Ladies Auxiliary; VFW #2281 Ladies Auxiliary; Women's Bowling Association; Friends of the Library; and served on the county library board.

Survivors include two sons, Steven of Mesa, Ariz., and Frank (Cindy) of Thermopolis; and two grandchildren.

Preceding Alice in death was her husband; sister, Mildred Brejcha; and brother, James Brejcha.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, May 24 at Community Church with the Rev. Chuck Cooper officiating. Burial followed at Monument Hill Cemetery.
