

Removing the Construction Notice

<u>4-1 from the County Land Use Plan</u> Commissioner Scheel requested the striking of 4-1 out of the Land Use Plan. 4-1 Construction Notice required (A) Structures Requiring Construction Notice and (B) Exempt Structures. Scheel stated the goal of the notice is to curb potential misuse of land, take care of septic notifications and just to have a general idea of what's going on in the County. He thinks the construction of or on the use of land is probably the one thing that is least understood. Discussion ensued on the construction notice in newspaper ads, information being sent out with tax notices, what notification needs to be done for a land use change, what constitutes a land change, and contacting the Hot Springs County Planner. Chairman Tom Ryan was not in favor of removing the construction notice as he indicated if you own property and you are thinking about changing the use you need to talk to the County Planner. The problems arise when someone changes the use without going through the proper channels when all it would have taken is a call or visit with the County Planner. He also mentioned that another discussion they should be having is how hard of a line should they take if people do not follow the rules. Commissioner Scheel moved that they strike 4-1 Construction Notice from the Land Use Plan. Jack Baird seconded. After further discussion, a vote was held and Commissioner Scheel voted in favor and both Commissioners Baird and Ryan were opposed. The motion failed

The Hot Springs County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, September 21, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Meeting Room at the Government Annex. Present were Commissioners Tom Ryan, Jack Baird and Phillip Scheel. Also present were County Clerk Becky Kersten. Chairman Ryan led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Phillip Scheel moved to approve the agenda with the addition of "Other Business Item 2" - Commissioner Support of Round Top to T-Hill Trail. Jack Baird seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**TANF/CPI Grant Application** 

Phillip Scheel moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Community Partnership Initiative (TANF CPI) Grant application. The requested amount of funding is \$19,500.00. Jack Baird seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approach Agreement

Jack Baird moved to approve the Silver Creek Midstream Approach Agreement. Phillip Scheel seconded the motion. Discussion: Road & Bridge will only be constructing the approach; Silver Creek will be supplying gravel and culvert. All fees have been received. Road & Bridge Supervisor has reviewed the application and has no objections. Motion carried.

Phillip Scheel moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the FMLA request for Penny Herdt beginning September 16, 2021. Jack Baird seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Dusty Lewis, representing the Hot City

Outdoor Alliance, requested the County approve a resolution supporting the application of Wyoming Pathways to the Wyoming department of State Parks and Cultural Resources for a Recreational Trail Program Grant. Jack Baird moved to approve Resolution 2021-06 as follows:

RESOLUTION #2021-06 RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE APPLICATION OF WYOMING <u>PATHWAYS TO THE WYOMING</u> <u>DEPARTMENT OF STATE PARKS</u> AND CULTURAL RESOURCES FOR <u>A RECREATIONAL TRAIL</u> PROGRAM GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF UP TO \$50,000 TO BUILD AND CONSTRUCT A SUSTAINABLE TRAIL CONNECTING THE ROUND TOP TRAIL TO T-HILL AND HOT

SPRINGS STATE PARK WHEREAS, recreational opportunities and access to hiking and biking trails are important to the residents of Hot Springs County, Wyoming ("County");

WHEREAS, the Recreational Trail Program (RTP) Grant is an opportunity for increased funding to provide support for the creation and maintenance of hiking and biking trails in the Thermopolis and Hot Springs County area;

WHEREAS, trails such as the new T-Hill Trail have seen a continuous increase in use from County and Town residents as well as increasingly become a destination for visitors on a year-round basis to our community;

WHEREAS, the Hot City Outdoor Alliance, Town of Thermopolis and other community partners recently completed the Thermopolis Community Trail Plan, which identified the Round Top to T-Hill Trail as the "highest trail priority for the commu-

WHEREAS, Wyoming Pathways is requesting RTP funds to construct the Round Top to T-Hill Connector Trail project and Wyoming Pathways will donate its administrative and project management services to construct a quality trail and complete the RTP grant requirements;

WHEREAS, Wyoming Pathways is working closely with the Hot Springs Outdoor Alliance, Town and County, Chamber of Commerce, and community partners on this trail;

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Department of State Parks and Cultural Resources requires a five-year agreement between a nonprofit and government agency to apply for a RTP grant;

WHEREAS, access to quality outdoor recreation is increasingly important for Wyoming to diversify our economy and enhance the quality of life in our communities. This project is an outstanding example of the type of investment that will help

achieve our goals.

NOW THEREFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HOT SPRINGS COUNTY WYOMING, RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the foregoing recitals are incorporated in and made a part of this resolution by this reference.

Section 2. That the County acknowledges edges that outdoor recreational opportunities are an important aspect to the County economic development and access to public land for residents and visitors alike and are vital to improve the quality of life for pres-

ent and future generations.

Section 3. That the Hot Springs County Board of Commissioners supports the application of Wyoming Pathways to the Wyoming Department of State Parks and Cultural Resources for Recreational Trail Grant in the amount of up to \$50,000 to construct the Round Top to T-Hill Connector Trail, a key component of the Hot Springs area trail system.

Section 4. That this trail partnership agreement with the County and Wyoming Pathways shall have a term of up to 5-years, with the first project being the Round Top to T-Hill Connector Trail Project. Any and all future year trail projects shall be subject to the prior review and approval of the Hot Springs Board of County Commissioners.
