The Hot Springs County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, December 7, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Meeting Room at the Government Annex. Present were Commissioners Tom

Ryan, Jack Baird and Phillip Scheel. Also present were County Attorney Jill Logan, and County Clerk Becky Kersten. Chairman Ryan led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Phillip Scheel moved to approve the agenda with the addition of Executive Session for possible litigation. Jack Baird seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes

Jack Baird moved to approve the minutes of November 16, 2021 as presented. Phil Scheel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

<u>Public Hearing – Resolution 2021-08</u>

- FY 2021-22 Budget Amendment No. 1 Resolution 2021-08 for Budget Amendment No. 1 due to receipt of funding from the TAP commission and unanticipated jail revenue. Chairman Ryan opened the public hearing at 9:05 a.m. and opened the floor to public comment. After three calls for public comment and hearing none, Chairman Ryan declared the hearing closed at 9:06 a.m. Jack Baird moved to pass Resolution 2021-08 for Budget Amendment No. 1 to add \$100,000 revenue and expense for the TAP grant, and to add \$4,537 unanticipated revenue and \$4,537 to Jail Repair and Maintenance line item. Phillip Scheel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Grant Request - Law Enforcement

<u>Assistance Program</u>

Sheriff Jerimie Kraushaar asked Commissioners to approve the Sheriff's Office to apply for a Northern and Middle States Rural Law Enforcement Assistance Program Grant, a 100% grant with no County match, up to \$150,000. Sheriff Kraushaar's intent is to use the grant funds for a K-9 dog. The grant would fully fund the dog, training of a deputy to become a handler, and up fit of a vehicle. Sheriff Kraushaar estimates the K-9 program would cost in the range of \$20,000 to \$25,000. Sheriff Kraushaar informed the Commissioners the dog can be transferred to another handler, if the deputy assigned were to leave the department. There will not be an option for the handler to buy out the dog from the department. The grant cannot be used for normal operating expenses. Phillip Scheel moved to grant permission for the Sheriff to apply for up to \$150,000 grant primarily for a K-9 program. Jack Baird seconded. Motion passed.

Tax Rebate #5-21 - Citation Oil & <u>Gas Corp</u>

Deputy Assessor Cody Stewart presented Tax Rebate #5-21 for the Commissioners' approval. Jack Baird moved to approve the Chairman's signature on Rebate #5-21 - parcel #3374 for tax year 2019 (District 100) -Citation Oil & Gas Corp in the amount of \$150.77. Phillip Scheel seconded the motion.

GIS Program Monthly Report

GIS Clerk Cody Stewart presented the Commissioners an update of the ongoing GIS project. Ms. Stewart explained the County Planner has a use for a layer for land use purposes. In addition, Road and Bridge has use for more easement and right-of-way layers and thought a collector app would be useful to track gravel inventory and use. These queries would not necessarily be public queries, but used by the interested departments.

Public Health /Prevention Monthly

PHN Manager Tricia McPhie reported

intent to begin advertising for the full-time Public Health Response Coordinator position allowed through the COVID grant. The fulltime position will be additional help for the County's current part-time Public Health Response Coordinator. Foot clinics will resume this week. COVID clinics are every Thursdays with some Fridays to accommodate school kids. COVID boosters started October 28 and Public Health has given over 700 vaccinations. Hot Springs County is still third in the State for COVID vaccination coverage at 47%. National Sources of Strength trainers are not available until next spring, but Prevention will continue local training.

FBO Monthly Report

FBO Nate Messenger reported there were 118 total recorded operations in November, with 2 aircraft overnight, 2 requests for hangar space, and 3 air ambulances. Fuel sales totaled 2,463.73 gallons of AvGas and 697.3 gallons of Jet Fuel. Mr. Messenger indicated Bemidji Aviation would haul UPS freight through Christmas. Mr. Messenger also reported he replaced the photocell for the apron floodlights.

Road and Bridge Monthly Report

Road & Bridge Supervisor Shane Rankin reported good weather has allowed crews to continue to blade roads, cattle guards have been cleaned, and highway rural fire number sign replacement has been completed. Mr. Rankin discussed with the Commissioners his desire to continue an expansion of replacing the signs on roads with a high need, as budget allows. Commissioners agreed with the expanded project within budget. The Commissioners also recommended Mr. Rankin contact Hot Springs County Fire District to see if they would contribute funding towards future rural fire number replacement.

WYDOT MOU - FY 2022 High Risk Rural Roads Project

This is a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") only no money is exchanged. WYDOT will purchase and deliver replacement signs and posts to the County; the Road and Bridge Department will install the signs. Phillip Scheel moved the Chairman's signature on the MOU between WYDOT and Hot Springs County for the High Risk Rural Roads Federal Project HRR 0.00 HR22901. Jack Baird seconded. Motion passed.

Maintenance Monthly Report - Annex/ Public Health Building - the Town informed Mr. Culliton that the Annex/Public Health building water meter failed. The Town recommended changing the size to a residential meter. Mr. Culliton will look at pricing and space constraints before making any size change recommendations. LEC/Detention <u>Center</u> - Jadeco replaced a failed relay in the exhaust fan in the generator room. Mr. Culliton also recommended the County consider upgrading the combo sink/stool units in the jail cells along with upgrading the plumbing through the office spaces due to continued failures of piping, flush valves and faucets. Commissioners recommended contacting a mechanical engineer or contractor to assist with the project. <u>Museum</u> - Jadeco has the northeast sump pump working and now the southeast sump pump is not working. Fair Building Roof Project - Mr. Culliton met with the Fair Board and will keep them updated. Architect firm QC10 has pushed completion of the plans to mid-December. <u>Court-House/</u> <u>Law Enforcement Center Re-roof project</u> -Mr. Culliton has contacted the County's commercial insurance, WARM, and provided a copy of the re-roof bid. WARM will look at the bid to determine what will be covered by insurance due to hail damage.

Planner Monthly Report

The NPRC did not meet in November, but will meet December 8. Regarding the DuFour Land use change, the applicants have asked for additional time to find an engineer to work on the septic system. The LUPC will not meet in December, but plan to meet in January 2022. The Porath land use change application was withdrawn; Mr. Bowman has encouraged the Porath's to complete the application process. Mr. Bowman said there have been concerns voiced regarding enforcement of some applications. The Commissioners expressed their concerns regarding withdrawn plans because it appears some landowners may continue with projects without the benefit of a County permit. Planner Bowman reported nine of 12 approved septic systems have been constructed.

Wyoming Office of Homeland Security 2021 SHSP Program Grant

Emergency Management Coordinator Bill Gordon presented the Commissioners with a 2021 State Homeland Security Program Grant to purchase one new mobile and four portable radios. The handhelds are to be available for emergencies within the County. Phillip Scheel moved the Chairman's signature on the grant agreement between the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security and Hot Springs County for Project No. 21-SHSP-HOT-INT grant in the amount of \$14,816.70. Jack Baird seconded. Motion passed.

Wyoming Gas Pipeline Safety Re-

 $Emergency \, Management \, Coordinator \, Bill \,$ Gordon discussed a letter received by Wyoming Gas inquiring whether Hot Springs County had any identified sites near Wyoming Gas' main transmission line. Bill viewed the map and Hot Springs County has no identified sites. Commissioners instructed Clerk Kersten to write a letter to Wyoming Gas stating Mr. Gordon's finding.

Emergency Management Monthly

<u>Report</u>

Emergency Management Coordinator Bill Gordon, informed the Commissioners the Region 6 Hazard Mitigation Plan has been updated and is ready for public review and comment. Comment period is December 3 through December 22, 2021. The Plan is posted on the County's home webpage, and there is a link to provide comments. The Plan covers all four counties in the Big Horn Basin. Mr. Gordon wanted to personally, and on behalf of Emergency management, publicly thank Dr. Miller for his time as public health officer.

Other Business - Court House/Law Enforcement Center Re-Roof Contract - Jack Baird moved the Chairman's signature on the Standard Form of Agreement with Redd Roofing Company of Wyoming for the Court House/Law Enforcement Center Re-Roof project in the amount of \$825,733. Phillip Scheel seconded. Motion passed. HSG Master Plan RFR #15 - Phillip Scheel moved to approve the Chairman's signature on RFR #15 for the HSG Master Plan in the amount of \$8,339.47. Jack Baird seconded the motion. Motion carried. <u>LGLP Board Member</u> Election Ballots - Commissioners reviewed the LGLP Board Member ballot.
