

### PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Procedural Rules and Special Regulations, notice is hereby given of the Application of Rocky Mountain Power (RMP or the Company) requesting authority to increase rates to recover deferred Net Power Costs (NPC) under Tariff Schedule 95; and to decrease rates pursuant to Tariff Schedule 93, Renewable Energy Credits (RECs) and Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) emission allowances, as more fully described below:

RMP is a public utility, as defined by Wyo. Stat. §37-1-101(a)(vi)(C), providing retail electric service under certificates of public convenience and necessity issued by the Commission. RMP is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §37-2-112.

On April 15, 2022, the Company submitted an Application requesting authority to revise rates pursuant to two different rate schedules: [i] its Energy Cost Adjustment Mechanism (ECAM) Tariff Schedule 95, requesting authority to collect approximately 25.9 million in deferred NPC; and, [ii] its REC and SO<sub>2</sub> revenue adjustment mechanism (RRA) Tariff Schedule 93, requesting authority to refund approximately \$2.7 million to customers to reflect the sale of RECs and SO<sub>2</sub> emission allowances. The total Energy Cost Adjustment Mechanism (ECAM) deferral from calendar year 2021 is a charge consisting of the following: [i] deferred ECAM costs of \$25.8 million after the applicable percent sharing band; [ii] accrued interest of approximately \$0.6 million; and [iii] a credit of approximately \$0.6 million to true-up revenues from the 2020 ECAM (Docket No. 20000-582-EM-20); and, the 2021 ECAM (Docket No. 20000-599-EM-21). The Company proposes to collect the deferral balance of \$25.9 million over a 12-month period beginning July 1, 2022. The Company requested interim approval of the proposed net increase, effective July 1, 2022, subject to further review.

The following table summarizes the proposed price changes by tariff rate schedule. Within each rate schedule, the percentage change to individual customers may be higher or lower than the average due to rate design, customer load factors, and usage characteristics. The combined effect of the 2022 RRA and ECAM in this Application represents an overall proposed rate decrease of approximately \$26.3 million or approximately 4.0 percent.

### COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The Thermopolis Town Council met in regular session May 3, 2022, at 7 pm at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Mike Chimenti, Council members Tony Larson, John Dorman Sr., Bill Malloy and Dusty Lewis. Also present were Mayor/Codes Administrative Assistant Fred Crosby, Clerk/Treasurer Tracey Van Heule, Town Engineer Anthony Barnett, Public Works Director Ernie Slagle, Police Chief Pat Cornwell and Town Attorneys Mike Messenger and Marshall Keller.  
**AGENDA:** Following the pledge of allegiance, Malloy made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the agenda as written.

**MINUTES:** Lewis made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the Council meeting minutes from April 5 and 19, 2022.

**BILLS:** Larson made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the General, Enterprise and Special Fund bills for April 2022.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: GARY GREEN: MAIN STREET THERMOPO-LIS: BREWFEST:** Larson made a motion, seconded by Lewis and carried to approve a Malt Beverage permit on June 4, 2022, for the Main Street Brewfest. It was agreed to

allow Broadway between 4th and 5th street to be closed on June 4, 2022, from noon to 9pm for the Brewfest. It was noted both sides of the street will be closed.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: JACKIE DOROTHY: TRAVEL & TOURISM UP-DATES:** Dorothy asked for \$5,000 to \$10,000 in funding for a visual billboard to replace the event board near the Fair Grounds. She noted the sign will cost about \$120,000 and \$70,000 has been raised. Discussion ensued, the Mayor and Council will consider the request in the upcoming budget.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: MERIANN RUSH: OVERSIZED PARKING SIGNS:** Rush asked for an area for oversized parking. Discussion ensued. Crosby, Barnett and Slagle will present an option for the oversized parking at the next council meeting.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: OFF-TRACK BETTING MACHINES:** Jill Jarrard representing Wyoming Downs noted that business owner, Jennifer Fisher would like para-mutual machines at OEB Saloon. Jarrard noted the County commissioners approved Wyoming Downs to operate in the county. She discussed disbursement of funds, other para-mutual locations in the state, gaming commission rules and procedures and asked for permission to allow the machines at OEB Saloon. Messenger noted the Town code would require amendment to allow the gaming machines. Jarrard noted once approved, it could take up to six months to install the machines. OEB Saloon is considering 18 to 20 machines. Lewis made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to amend the ordinance to allow for para-mutual gambling.

**TOWN ENGINEER: ANTHONY BARNETT: NOTICE TO PROCEED-SILO PAINTING:** Larson made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the notice to proceed to Carr Coatings on the silo painting project. Barnett also noted four contractors were present for the pre-bid meeting on the water project bid. The bid opening is May 11th.

**DEPARTMENT REPORTS:** Police Chief Cornwell presented the April police report. Slagle presented the Streets and Alleys, Water, Wastewater, Sanitation and Landfill reports. It was noted Slagle has worked for the Town for 45 years. Crosby noted Family Dollar was open.

**TOWN ATTORNEY: MICHAEL MESSENGER:** Messenger noted there will likely be no changes to the Charter franchise agreement. Discussion ensued on receiving drawings of buried cable lines, most are overhead.

**ADMINISTRATION:** Crosby noted the Spring cleanup is May 16 to 21, 2022.

**MAYOR AND COUNCIL:** Lewis noted the Roundtop trail is nearing completion. The meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm. The next Council meeting is May 17, 2022, at 7pm.
