COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The Thermopolis Town Council met in

regular session September 5, 2023, at 7 pm at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Adam Estenson, Council members Bill Malloy, John Dorman Sr., and Rachel Hughes. Also present were Mayor/Codes Administrative Assistant Jim Jeunehomme, Clerk/Treasurer Tracey Van Heule, Police Chief Pat Cornwell, Town Engineer Anthony Barnett and Town Attorney Marshall Keller. Council Member Dusty Lewis was absent. AGENDA: Following the pledge of alle-

giance, Dorman made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the agenda as written. MINUTES: Malloy made a motion, sec-

onded by Hughes and carried to approve the Council meeting minutes from August 1 and 15, 2023.

BILLS: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the General, Enterprise and Special Fund bills for August 2023.

STREETS IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve opening a new account for streets improvement. The funding will come from the direct distribution from

the state that was larger than budgeted. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: CATER-ING PERMITS: Dorman made a motion and Malloy seconded to approve three catering permits for OEB Saloon and one for Shorty's. The first is for the Cavin cookie jar auction at the fairgrounds on September 9, the second is for the Gottsche Boots & Bling on September 16 and the third is for a wedding reception on September 23, 2023. The Shorty's permit is for the Farm Bureau Banquet on September 30 from 3pm to midnight. All permits were for the fair building. Motion carried. Fair Board approval was received.

HOT CITY OUTDOOR ALLIANCE: Wade Lippincott, representing the group, provided information on the 8th street boat ramp. A motion was made by Malloy, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the 16' x 16' boat ramp (funded by the Alliance and sponsors) and to provide help in removing trees in the area.

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: MERI ANN DORMAN: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to allow for a street closure on October 26, for Moonlight Madness between 4th and 5th streets, on Broadway from 5:30 pm to 9pm. Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to allow the lighted Christmas parade and corresponding street closures on December 2, 2023.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: AMANDA COXBILL: Coxbill noted she would like to be involved with the re-habilitation committee for Family Park and was concerned about the lack of trees. Estenson noted new equipment was coming for the park. Trees and picnic areas will be discussed after in-

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: The Police report, the Streets and Alleys, Water, Wastewater, Sanitation and Landfill reports and Engineering reports were available for review.

TOWN ATTORNEY: SECOND READ-<u>ING OF THE TOBACCO ORDINANCE:</u> Keller read the ordinance, which updates the town code definition of tobacco. Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to approve the second reading of the ordinance.

ADMINISTRATION: FAMILY PARK **EQUIPMENT:** Jeunehomme noted equipment for Family Park was ordered and came in under budget. However, an additional \$6,160 is needed for fall material and plans are to re-allocate funds within the one-cent budget. Discussion ensued on timelines, the old equipment, the fall area and table areas with shade similar to Bi-centennial Park.

ADMINISTRATION: OTHER: Jeunehomme noted the single bid for the streetsweeper was publicly opened on September 5 at 2pm. The bid was from Joe Johnson for an Elgin Pelican Street sweeper for \$268,364.00. Dorman made a motion and Malloy to approve the bid, contingent upon staff review. Discussion ensued on the 2009 current machine, the differences between an air and mechanical sweepers and the lack of parts for the old machine. Motion carried.

ADMINISTRATION: ORDINANCE DIS-CUSSION: Discussion ensued on changing several ordinances including signs, RV parking, fluoride and home occupation permits.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: Hughes made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to adjourn at 7:45 pm. The next Council meeting is September 19, 2023, at 7pm.

WY-TOP test scores released

Hot Springs County School District #1 (HSCSD1) has a lot to celebrate and also some areas of weakness as shown in the Wyoming assessment rankings released by the Wyoming Department of Education in September. Teachers and students achieved top ten rankings in academic performance in English language arts, math and science.

The federal Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) reinforces the authority of states to decide which statewide assessments are the most appropriate for its students. Wyoming's state assessment, the Wyoming Test of Proficiencv and Progress (WY-TOPP), assesses students on the Wyoming Content and Performance Standards. It is administered online and is a computer-adaptive assessment. This state summative assessment is an end-of-year test that measures how much students have learned during the school year.

Students in grades 3-10 take the WY-TOPP and WY-ALT assessments for Math and English Language Arts (ELA). Grade 3, 5, 7, and 9 students are also assessed in Writing on WY-TOPP. Students in grades 4, 8, and 10 are assessed in Science on WY-TOPP and

There are 48 school districts in Wyoming. The top ten rankings indicate HSCSD1's percentage of proficient/advanced students in comparison to the other districts small and large, in other words, to determine ranking districts are sorted from highest percentage of students proficient to lowest. HSCSD1 students scored above the state average in 15 of the 19 tested areas and achieved strong results in regard to the percent of HSCSD1 students scoring "advanced" on WyTOPP. Students scoring "proficient" are able to independently demonstrate grade level skills as established by the Wyoming Department of Education in ELA, math and science on the spring assessment. Students scoring "advanced" are able to perform above grade level academic skills.

HSCSD1 earned three top rankings in 7th, 8th and 9th grade math. The high school had top five rankings in every tested area - English, Math, Science and the ACT Composite. The district also had the 1st/2nd highest percentage of students scoring advanced in eight tested areas across the district in comparison to all 48 of the other districts.

Areas identified that HSCSD1 needs to work on include 3rd, 4th and 5th grade English Language Arts. For 3rd grade, 40% of students scored proficient or advanced compared to 48% for the state average, 4th grade was 42% compared to 45% and 5th grade was 54% compared to 55%. In math, 38% of 3rd graders scored proficient or advanced compared to the state average of 53%.

According to Breez Longwell Daniels, Curriculum and professional Learning Coordinator, "Scores and rankings show us where we have work to do in regard to collaboratively building a guaranteed and viable curriculum to better support student learning. Together we will get better."

Increased West Nile Virus Cases in Wyoming


As Wyoming experiences more West Nile virus (WNV) activity this season than over the past decade or so, the Wyoming Department of Health (WDH) is emphasizing mosquito bite prevention.

There have been 20 cases reported, including a death in an older adult Fremont County woman, among Wyoming residents so far this year. Of these, 12 cases have involved the more severe neuroinvasive type of illness.

Cases have been reported from Campbell, Fremont, Goshen, Laramie, Natrona, Park, Platte, Sheridan and Washakie counties. Mosquito pools and animals from around the state continue to test positive for the virus.

While most infected people don't have symptoms, among those who become ill, symptoms include fever, headache, body aches, skin rash and diarrhea. A very small number of individuals develop West Nile neuroinvasive disease with symptoms such as severe headache, fever, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors. convulsions and paralysis.
