COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The Thermopolis Town Council met in regular session on November 7, 2023, at 7 pm at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Adam Estenson, Council members Bill Malloy, John Dorman Sr., and Rachel Hughes. Also present were Mayor/Codes Administrative Assistant Jim Jeunehomme, Clerk/Treasurer Tracey Van Heule, Police Chief Pat Cornwell, Town Engineer Anthony Barnett and Town Attorney Marshall Keller. Council member Dusty Lewis was absent.

AGENDA: Following the pledge of allegiance, Dorman made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the agenda as written.

MINUTES: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to approve the Council meeting minutes from October 3 and 17, 2023 and the executive session minutes from October 3 and 17, 2023.

BILLS: Dorman made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the General, Enterprise and Special Fund bills for October 2023.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: JAMES SECKMAN: 2023 AUDIT RESULTS: Seckman presented the audit of the Town's June 30, 2023, financial statements. The audit includes reviewing accounting principles, assessing deficiencies (lack of segregation of duties), assessing compliance and reviewing reserves. The water fund has a negative cash flow, and a rate increase was recommended. The auditor's opinion noted the town's financial statements fairly present the town's financial position.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION: JASON BOWMAN – COMMUNITY CONCERN: Bowman expressed concern about intimidation from Sargent Mascorro. He also expressed concern that complaints are not taken seriously and noted that the public has complained about escalating behavior by Sargent Mascorro. He asked for transparency from town leadership and accountability for Sargent Mascorro's actions and behavior. In discussion it was noted that Bowman has not filed a formal complaint. It was recommended that he do so. Additional community members asked about the town's policies and procedures, complaints, (complaints are filed with the department head and not confidential, as a person has a right to know their accuser), the 4th amendment to the Bill of Rights, law enforcement duties, support for Sargent Mascorro, drug related arrests, bullying and accountability. Mayor Estenson noted information can be requested on a specified form, encouraged filing official complaints and recommended in-person communication with elected officials.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: The Police report, the Streets and Alleys, Water, Wastewater, Sanitation and Landfill reports and Engineering reports were available for review. Barnett noted the water plant boiler was repaired, the Buffalo Ridge subdivision is expected to move forward in the spring and a water rights utilization report was

sent to the state. Hughes requested that Public Works Director Sorensen attend the meetings.

CODES: JIM JEUNEHOMME: TEXT MY GOV PROPOSAL: Jeunehomme noted Text my Gov issued a new proposal, to keep the county and town separate, with a cost of \$3,750 for the first year and \$2,500 for the next year. Estenson noted he would like to join the county. Malloy made a motion to join with the county on the text-my-gov app. Motion failed for lack of a second. Dorman made a motion, seconded by Hughes, for the town to move forward separately. Discussion ensued on how the app would be used. Dorman and Hughes voted yes, Malloy and Estenson voted no. Motion failed. Jeunehomme will schedule a meeting to clarify the proposal.

CODES: FENCERIGHT-OF-WAY PERMIT: Jeunehomme presented a fence permit for 1045 Warren (corner lot). He noted the permit was started in 2015 and not finished. Dorman made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the fence right-of-way permit with a 3-foot wrought iron fence on the front and side of the property.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: LGLP BOARD BALLOT: Estenson asked that the decision be moved to the next meeting. Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to adjourn at 7:50 pm. The next Council meeting is November 21, 2023, at 7pm.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The Thermopolis Town Council met in regular session on November 21, 2023, at 7 pm at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Adam Estenson, Council members Bill Malloy, John Dorman Sr., Rachel Hughes and Dusty Lewis. Also, present were Mayor/Codes Administrative Assistant Jim Jeunehomme, Clerk/Treasurer Tracey Van Heule, Police Chief Pat Cornwell, Public Works Director Basil Sorensen, Town Attorney Marshall Keller and Town Engineer Anthony Barnett.

AGENDA: Following the pledge of allegiance, Malloy made a motion, seconded by Lewis and carried to approve the agenda as written.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the financial statement for October 2023.

CHIEF OF POLICE: GRANTS: Chief Cornwell presented the following five grants for approval. Homeland Security \$27,078 for software which allows officers to look up drivers licenses from their vehicle and software to allow citations to be sent directly to the courts; \$2,800 for bulletproof vests; \$3,135 for impaired driving enforcement; \$2,000 for seat belt enforcement; and \$1,000 for underage drinking enforcement. made a motion, seconded by Hughes, and carried, to approve the five grants.

TOWN DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Public Works Director Sorensen noted a sewer pump and variable frequency drives were replaced. Town Engineer Barnett noted he is working with the DEQ on transfer station funding and location.

TOWN ATTORNEY: WATER RATE ORDINANCE: Keller read the proposed ordinance which would raise the base rate from \$19.80 to \$25.00 per month. Malloy made a motion, seconded by Dorman and carried to approve the first reading of the ordinance.

TOWN ATTORNEY: BAR & GRILL LIQUOR ORDINANCE: Keller read the ordinance which would increase the number of bar and grill licenses from two to four as allowed by recent changes to state statutes. Dorman made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to approve the first reading of the ordinance.

TOWN ATTORNEY: AMEND ORDINANCE 864: Keller noted there was a Scribner error in the prior ordinance. The reference should be to state statute 11-25-306, not 11-255-09. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the first reading of the ordinance.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: OTHER: Discussion ensued on the text-my gov app. In a recent Zoom meeting, it was determined that joining with the county would make it more difficult for the end-user. Dorman made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to purchase the text-my-gov software, with a separate account.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: LGLP BOARD MEMBER ELECTION: Malloy made a motion, seconded by Huges and carried to cast the town's ballot for Michael Bailey for municipal representative. Malloy made a motion, seconded by Hughes and carried to cast the town's ballot for Richard Grant Jr. for county commissioners' representative and Hale Redding for special district representative.

MAYOR & COUNCIL: EXECUTIVE SESSION: At 7:26 Lewis made a motion, seconded by Malloy and carried to enter executive session, to discuss confidential information, as allowed under state statute 16-4-405(a) (ix). Regular session resumed at 7:46 pm. No action was taken.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL: At 7:46 Lew-is made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Hughes and carried. The next Council meeting is December 5, 2023, at 7pm.
