

Speech and debate team wins at Worland, runner-up at Riverton

The Hot Springs Speech and Debate Team continued their successful season, bringing home a 1A/2A Championship trophy for the second time this season after finishing first at the large Worland Speech and Debate Tournament held at Worland High School on December 12-13, 2025. The Bobcats followed up the Worland competition after holiday break with a second place 1A/2A sweepstakes trophy at the Riverton Speech and Debate Tournament at Riverton High School on February 16-17, 2026.

Senior Dean Bihr and junior Annalyn Sharp were crowned tournament champions in Policy Debate at Worland and finished third in Policy at Riverton. Bihr also advanced into Super Congress at Riverton and finished eighth overall in a large pool of competitors.

Senior Luci Andreen was a semifinalist in Program Oral Interpretation at Worland, while fellow senior Kass Chavez placed in the top twenty of many competitors in the same event at Riverton. The Duo team of sophomores, Allyssa Hough and Bryce Potter, and juniors, Aubriana Layman and Hayden Franklin, finished in the top twenty competitors of both Worland and Riverton. Junior Teancum Gevas finished in the top twenty of Impromptu Speaking after

advancing into quarterfinals at Riverton. Novices performed well at the Worland tournament. Sophomore Ammon Wille competed in Lincoln-Douglas Debate, finishing with a 2-2 record and sixth place. Wille also earned sixth place in Extemporaneous Speaking and joined sophomores, Rylee Simpson and Brian Weaver, to compete in World Schools Debate, earning third place at Riverton. Additionally, freshman Emily Hamrick finished in fourth place in Novice Humorous Interpretation at Worland.

Sophomore Clayton Keller had a breakthrough performance at Riverton, advancing through quarterfinals, semifinals, and finally finishing in sixth place in both Impromptu Speaking and Informative Speaking - both events with very large pools of competitors.

Head Coach Lyle Wiley was impressed with the team effort at both large tournaments bookending a long holiday break. "These Cats are resilient and talented, and they support each other in impressive ways. They keep working hard and growing. I can't wait to see where this year takes us," said Wiley.

Next for the Bobcats is the Riverside Speech and Debate Tournament at Riverside High School in Basin on January 24.

Company) request for authority enter
and participate in the California Inde-
pendent System Operator's (CAISO)
Extended Day-Ahead Market (EDAM).
**The public hearing is set to commence
on Thursday, February 5, 2026, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commis-
sion's hearing room located at 2515
Warren Avenue, Suite 300, in Chey-
enne, Wyoming.**

2. RMP is a division of PacifiCorp, an
Oregon corporation, engaged in the busi-
ness of supplying electric utility service
to customers throughout its six-state
service territory, including Wyoming.
RMP is a public utility, subject to the

Commission's jurisdiction. Wyo Stat. §§
37-1-101(a)(vi)(C) and 37-2-112.

3. On December 30, 2024, RMP filed a
"Notice" that RMP was in the process of
preparing to enter and participate in the
EDAM. The Company filed the "Notice"
based upon a Commission directive to
file an Application after discussions with
the Company at open meetings held on
October 10, 2024, and October 17, 2024.

4. On February 18, 2025, RMP sub-
mitted an amended filing pursuant to the
provision of Commission Rule, Chapter
3, Section 21(f)(i). The Amended Appli-
cation seeks Commission approval to
allow RMP authority to enter and par-
ticipate in the CAISO's EDAM stating
that the Company's participation will re-
sult in certain reliability, economic and
environmental benefits to its Wyoming
Customers. The EDAM is an extension
of CAISO's Western Energy Imbalance
Market (WEIM) RMP has participated
in the WEIM since its inception in No-
vember of 2014.

5. Wyoming Industrial Energy Con-
sumers (WIEC) and Interwest Energy
Alliance petitioned to intervene in this
matter, which the Commission granted
by Order issued on May 14, 2025. The
Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA)
intervened on March 27, 2025, as a mat-
ter of right.

Oregon corporation, engaged in the busi-
ness of supplying electric utility service
to customers throughout its six-state
service territory, including Wyoming.
RMP is a public utility subject to the
Commission's jurisdiction. Wyo. Stat. §§
37-1-101(a)(vi)(C) and 37-2-112.

2. On December 31, 2025, pursuant
to Wyoming Statutes §§ 37-2-112 and
37-2-115, the Company filed an Appli-
cation requesting the Commission issue
a Deferred Accounting Order to record
and defer a regulatory asset associated
with the differences in incremental costs
and revenues between the 2020 Proto-
col and the 2026 Protocol cost allocation
methodologies, effective January 1, 2026.

3. The 2020 Protocol expired Decem-
ber 31, 2025. The 2026 Protocol Applica-
tion is set for hearing on May 26, 2026, in
Docket No. 20000-690-EA-25. The 2026
Protocol proposes a new cost allocation
methodology across RMP's multiple state
service territory that includes Wyoming.
The Company requested the deferral to
address costs incurred during
in this matter must file with the Com-
mission in writing on or before February
9, 2026. Any intervention request filed
with the Commission shall set forth the
grounds of the proposed intervention or
request for hearing as well as the posi-
tion and the interest of the petitioner in
