NOTICE SETTING PUBLIC HEARING

1. Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Rules, notice is hereby given that a public hearing is scheduled regarding Rocky Mountain Power's (RMP or the Company) request for authority for a non-situs Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the Spanish Fork to Mercer Transmission Project located in Utah. **The public hearing is set to commence on Monday, April 13, 2026, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commission's hearing room located at 2515 Warren Avenue, Suite 300, in Cheyenne, Wyoming.**

2. RMP is a division of PacifiCorp, an Oregon corporation, engaged in the business of supplying electric utility service to customers throughout its six-state service territory, including Wyoming. RMP is a public utility, subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. Wyo. Stat. §§ 37-1-101(a)(vi)(C) and 37-2-112.

3. On August 1, 2025, RMP submitted its Application together with supporting workpapers, pursuant to Wyoming Statute § 37-2-205 (a)(b), requesting a non-situs CPCN to construct 1) a 345-kilovolt (kV) 45-mile transmission line from Spanish Fork to Mercer, Utah; 2) 90-120 foot monopole steel towers with double bundled 1272 aluminum-conductor steel reinforced cable Bittern Conductor framed out to 345 kV construction; and 3) half-inch extra high strength Steel Shield Wire and optical ground wire fiber. The Company states the project is necessary to provide the capacity to serve the load growth in the Utah Valley region, alleviate thermal overload and system strain, and address emergency causing issues.

4. Wyoming Industrial Energy Consumers (WIEC) and the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA) petitioned to intervene in this matter, which the Commission granted by Order issued on October 20, 2025.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Wyoming Public Service Commission approved the Application of Wyoming Gas Company to pass on a wholesale commodity cost increase of \$0.0073 per CCF to its customers, effective for usage on and after October 1, 2025. The proposed change is due to an increase in the wholesale price of natural gas and a decrease in the Commodity Balancing Account surcharge.

The Company's proposal results in an increase of \$0.51 or 0.83% before taxes in the monthly bill for a typical residential customer using 70 CCF during the rate effective period of October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026. Actual bills will vary with usage.

Commission Rule Chapter 3, Section 26 allows a utility to pass-on, to its customers, known or projected commodity cost increases or decreases, on a dollar-for-dollar basis, subject to public notice, opportunity for hearing and refund.

Don't miss April 30 deadline for winter heating assistance

SHERIDAN (WNE) — Only a few weeks remain for Wyoming residents to apply for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program for the 2025-2026 season, with the deadline set for April 30. The Wyoming Department of Family Services urges residents to apply as soon as possible to get help with winter heating bills and emergencies.

LIEAP is a federally funded program that helps eligible households pay a portion of their winter heating bills. The program also provides support during emergencies, like a broken furnace or a possible utility shutoff. Apply now online at leapwyo.org or call 1-800-246-4221.

To qualify for LIEAP, applicants must be Wyoming residents with households whose gross annual income is at or below 60% of the state's median income. For example, this includes limits of \$35,829 for an individual, \$46,853 for a couple, or \$68,902 for a family of four. Homeowners, renters, and residents of permanently parked RVs or campers are all eligible to apply.

If you have already started an application, you must complete and submit it along with all required documents by the April 30

deadline. The program cannot process draft applications or provide assistance without a submitted application.

Yellowstone Park visits near record high: 2025 totals top previous year's count

CODY (WNE) — Yellowstone National Park welcomed 4,762,988 recreation visits in 2025, slightly more than last year and the highest in the last decade except for the record-breaking number of more than 4.8 million in 2021.

The National Park Service released the 2025 visitation report Tuesday. Since 2015, more than 4 million visitors have come to YNP every year except 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic and 2022 during the June floods.

Last year, despite a 43-day partial government shutdown — the longest ever — the National Park Service worked to keep parks open and accessible whenever possible so visitors could continue to experience the nation's natural and historic treasures.

Highlights of the 2025 visitation number include 86,891,452 visitor hours spent in park and 1,238,983 overnight stays.

Visitation figures and trends help guide

how the NPS manages parks to ensure the best possible experience for visitors. The Visitation Statistics Dashboard on NPS.gov provides recreation visit data for every park in the U.S. for 2025 and previous years - dating back to 1979 for some parks.

Men plead not guilty to abusing moose

EVANSTON (WNE) — Three men accused of roping, riding and dragging an aged and feeble moose were arraigned in the Third District Court on Tuesday, March 17.

Justin Martin, 54, his son Range Martin, 23, of Uinta County and Kylan Platt of Malad City, Idaho, 22, each pleaded not guilty to their respective charges.

The case began in July of 2022 while Justin Martin was being investigated by the Wyoming Game and Fish Department for a separate, undisclosed offense. According to court documents, the game warden subsequently discovered "evidence of a potential major wildlife violation" on the elder Martin's cellphone.

The discoveries were later detailed as two videos allegedly depicting Platt roping, riding and spurring the moose and Range Martin roping and dragging the moose through

tall sage-brush on a separate occasion.

Court affidavits also identify Justin Martin as the person filming the incidents and encouraging the young men, saying "alright now, spur that son of a bitch ... spur on him!"

The interactions occurred roughly three weeks apart and, while it could not be determined that it was the same moose, the game warden testified in February that the animal featured in each of the videos was the "same approximate size" and "same body condition."

The moose was also described as thin and frail with "bone structure poking through its skin," graying and patchy fur and likely blind due to a sunken-in eye socket with an undetectable pupil.

If convicted, Range Martin and Platt each face up to four and a half years behind bars and/or \$26,000 in fines for identical charges of one felony count of cruelty to animals and two misdemeanor counts of wanton taking of a big game animal, a cow moose; and possession permit required for live warm-blooded wildlife, a cow moose.

Justin Martin faces up to six years behind bars and/or \$30,000 in fines for two felony counts of accessory before the fact to felony cruelty of animal and two misdemeanor counts of accessory before or after the fact to wanton taking of a big game animal.
